Jay then asked for suggestions as to future Section-sponsored forums on children's folklore (e.g., that held in 1986 on Girl's Play). Libby Tucker volunteered to look into a forum on Ethics in Children's Folklore Study for the 1988 meeting.

With the approval of the members present, the meeting was adjourned at 8:25 a.m.
