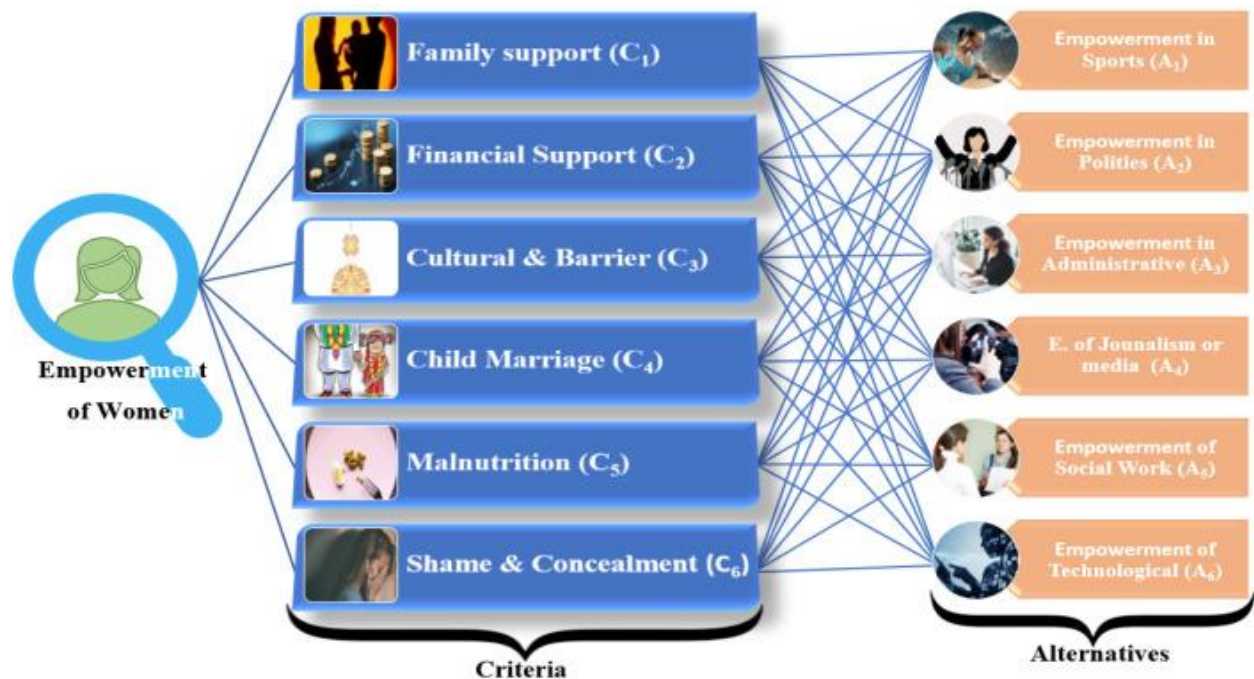

analysis. The methodology was designed to elicit rich, detailed insights into the experiences, challenges, and aspirations of women navigating the contemporary Turkish workforce.

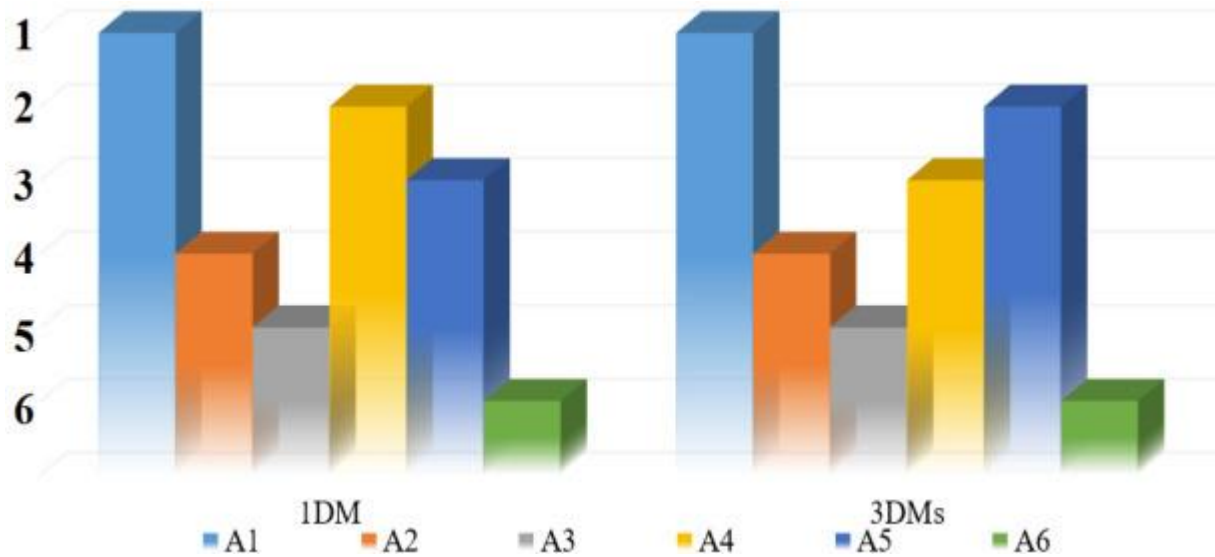
