

The Application and Challenges of the Multiple Intelligences Theory in Junior High School English Teaching

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Abstract: In the current wave of globalization, English, as a bridge for global communication, has increasingly highlighted its strategic status. The junior high school stage, as a critical period for laying the foundation of language and shaping learning habits, the quality of its English teaching is undoubtedly the cornerstone of students' future academic further studies and international communication capabilities. In view of this, the Ministry of Education promulgated the *new English Curriculum Standard* in 2022 in a timely manner. This standard takes a far - sighted approach and clearly points out that English teaching needs to deeply focus on four core objectives: language ability, cultural awareness, thinking quality and learning ability. The cultivation of these core literacy corresponds to Gardner's theory of multiple intelligence, both emphasizing student centeredness, exploring and developing students' multiple intelligence, so as to promote the improvement of students' comprehensive quality. This paper aims to use the theory of multiple intelligence as a lens to deeply explore its practical application in the field of junior high school English teaching, and carefully analyze various challenges that may be encountered in the implementation process. Through this discussion, it is intended to inject fresh vitality into the field of middle school English teaching, provide innovative teaching perspectives and strategies, so as to promote each student's personalized growth and all - round development in English learning.

Keywords: Gardner, Junior High School English Teaching, Theory of Multiple Intelligence.

1. Introduction

Against the backdrop of current globalization, the importance of English as an international common language has become increasingly prominent, and the junior high school stage, as a key period for students' language learning, the quality of its English teaching directly affects students' future study and life. The English Curriculum Standard issued by the Ministry of Education of China in 2022 clearly states that we should cultivate students with core literacy, putting forward new requirements for English teachers' teaching methods. However, many current English classrooms only use one teaching method singly, only focusing on the development of students' language knowledge, and failing to cultivate other qualities of students. The "Theory of Multiple Intelligence" (Gardner, 1983)^[3] proposed by Howard Gardner, a famous psychologist from Harvard University in the United States, in 1983 provides a new perspective and method for English teaching, emphasizing that education should pay attention to the development of students' individual multiple intelligences rather than single academic achievement. Our goal is to provide middle school English teachers with novel teaching ideas and strategies, in the hope that through personalized teaching, students' multiple intelligences can be fully stimulated, and they can be promoted to make more comprehensive and in - depth progress in English learning (Gardner, 1983)^[3]. From the definition and characteristics of the theory of multiple intelligences, it can be seen that this theory inspires teachers to guide each student to develop their own advantages, respect their own "zone of proximal development", pay attention to their overall development, so as to stimulate and cultivate their learning interest, build students' self - confidence, cultivate their abilities of autonomous learning and cooperative learning both, and thus

improve their observation, memory, imagination and innovation. In the field of foreign language teaching in the 21st century, promoting the comprehensive development of students' multiple intelligences has become a remarkable trend (Rodgers, 2000)^[10]. This paper will start from the perspective of the characteristics of the theory of multiple intelligences, discuss the application and challenges of the theory of multiple intelligences in junior high school English teaching, and provide new ideas and thoughts for the majority of middle school teaching in English classroom teaching.

2. Characteristics of the Theory of Multiple Intelligences

Howard Gardner's theory of multiple intelligences divides human intelligence into eight different types, and each type of intelligence represents a unique aspect of human cognitive ability (Shen Yiyuan & Yuan Xilin, 2021)^[14]. Linguistic intelligence is the bridge of the voice of the mind, allowing us to weave the threads of thought with precise words and deeply understand the profound meaning behind others' words (Gardner, 2011)^[4]. Logical - mathematical intelligence is the lighthouse of rational thinking, illuminating the road for us to carry out calculations and measurements, leading us to reason, induce and analyze, and ensuring that every step follows the track of logic. Spatial intelligence endows us with perceptive eyes to see through the world, possessing exceptional perception of spatial arrangements, color combinations, and form variations. Bodily - kinesthetic intelligence is the dialogue between the body and the mind, expressing emotions through body language, precise control, and showing dynamic beauty. Musical intelligence allows us to immerse ourselves in an ocean of notes, feeling the rise and fall of melody, the rhythm, and the subtle changes in timbre and tone. Interpersonal intelligence guides us in effective

communication, conflict resolution, and mutual understanding. Interpersonal intelligence guides us to communicate effectively, coordinate conflicts and enhance understanding. Intrapersonal intelligence is the mirror in the depths of the soul, helping us to know ourselves, evaluate objectively and achieve self - growth (Christison & Bassano,2005)^[2]. Naturalist intelligence is the antenna of our delicate perception of nature, allowing us to capture every unique place in the complex natural world and appreciate the mystery and diversity of life (Song Yingchao, 2017)^[12]. In educational practice, everyone is a unique combination of multiple intelligences. The difference in intelligence stems from the integration mode of different intelligences, not the advantages and disadvantages of a single intelligence. Personality should be respected, diversified teaching should be adopted, students' potential should be stimulated, comprehensive and personalized development should be promoted, and an inclusive and diversified educational ecology should be built. (Cao Shiyao & Lu Yonghong, 2011)^[6]. The theory of multiple intelligences encourages teachers to identify and cultivate different types of intelligence of students to promote the all - round development of students. By designing diversified teaching activities and assessment methods, teachers can better meet the intelligent needs of different students and help them discover and develop their potential. According to Gardner's explanation of the intelligence theory, we can summarize the characteristics of the intelligence theory as follows:

2.1. Diversity

The view of multiple intelligences enlightens us that human intelligences coexist in multiple ways, covering multiple dimensions such as linguistic, logical - mathematical, spatial, bodily - kinesthetic, musical - rhythmic, interpersonal, intrapersonal, and naturalist. The distribution of intelligence varies among individuals, and teachers need to keenly observe the differences among students and integrate them into teaching practice to guide positive learning attitudes (Ma Hong, 2022). Education should become a fertile soil for discovering and cultivating individual potential, rather than an arena for single academic intelligence, so that each student can shine in the field they are good at (Gao Jianfang, 2017)^[7].

2.2. Integrity

The integrity of the theory of multiple intelligences is reflected in that it regards intelligence as a comprehensive system including a variety of abilities, rather than a single intelligence. When applying the theory of multiple intelligences, the principle of integrity should be upheld, aiming to promote the all - round development of students, not limited to English, but ensuring that students can not only master solid theoretical knowledge but also flexibly apply it to practice in various fields including English, so as to achieve the comprehensive mastery and application of knowledge. (Ma Hong, 2022)^[11]. This theory emphasizes the diversity of intelligence, believes that everyone has a unique intelligence combination, and education should promote the balanced development of individuals in different intelligence fields to achieve the comprehensive development of individual potential.

2.3. Practicality

The theory of multiple intelligences has deeply shaped the face of educational practice, and its practicality is particularly

remarkable. Armstrong (2019)^[1] Thinks this theory focuses on the discovery and cultivation of students' multiple intelligences and advocates a student - centered personalized teaching model. Teachers need to accurately identify the intelligent advantages of each student and tailor teaching activities accordingly to ensure that the teaching plan can accurately meet the unique needs of students. This transformation has prompted the focus of education to expand from single academic achievement to the comprehensive development of students' comprehensive abilities, encouraging students to explore and grow in diversified fields (Gao,2017)^[15]. Finally, it not only improves the overall effectiveness of education but also significantly enhances students' adaptability and competitiveness in the face of future challenges.

3. Application of the Theory of Multiple Intelligences in English Teaching

3.1. Personalized Teaching Strategies

Under the guidance of the theory of multiple intelligences, personalized English teaching strategies focus on accurately identifying and making the most of students' intelligent advantages to deepen and broaden their English learning path. Teachers need to keenly observe the unique ability tendencies of each student, uphold the educational concept of "everyone has their own strengths and weaknesses", deeply analyze students' needs, and plan and implement a series of activities aimed at fully demonstrating students' multiple talents and expertise (Hanafin,2014)^[5]. Through these activities, not only can the barriers between students due to ability differences be broken, but also the understanding and respect among each other can be promoted, ensuring that each student can obtain balanced and comprehensive growth in the journey of English learning (Huang Yuanzhen, 2003)^[8]. First of all, teachers understand the intelligent characteristics of each student, such as linguistic intelligence, logical - mathematical intelligence, spatial intelligence, etc., through observation and evaluation, so as to provide them with learning materials and activities suitable for their respective intelligent characteristics. For example, for students with strong linguistic intelligence, teachers can encourage them to improve their English level through reading, writing and discussion; for students with strong spatial intelligence, teachers can use visual tools such as charts and maps to assist language learning. Secondly, personalized teaching strategies emphasize providing students with diversified learning paths. Teachers can design different teaching activities, such as role - playing, group discussion, project assignments, etc., to meet the needs of students with different intelligent types. Cao and Lu (2011)^[6] pointed out that classroom activity design needs to be diversified and accurate, avoiding generalization and abuse. According to the theory of multiple intelligences, it should meet the needs of different students and promote comprehensive development. For example, for students with weak body coordination, a series of quick reaction games can be designed to enhance their body coordination and agility; for students with spatial perception ability to be improved, they are encouraged to participate in the "little tour guide" activity to exercise their spatial intelligence by planning routes and describing spatial layouts; while for students with more introverted personalities, they are recommended to join the role - playing activity to focus on cultivating their

interpersonal and relationship intelligence through simulating the interaction between different roles, so as to promote their comprehensive development (Cao Shiyao & Lu Yonghong, 2011)^[6]. This teaching method can not only stimulate students' learning interest and improve the efficiency of English learning but also promote the all - round development of students and lay a solid foundation for their future study and life.

3.2. Teaching Content and Methods

Deeply integrating the concept of multiple intelligences into the design of English courses and carefully constructing a curriculum model and teaching plan based on multiple intelligences is the best starting point and core strategy for effectively practicing the theory of multiple intelligences in the field of English teaching (Huang Yuanzhen, 2003)^[8]. First of all, the teaching content is no longer limited to traditional language knowledge and skills, but is extended to interdisciplinary fields such as literature, art, science, etc. The selection and design of teaching content should go beyond traditional vocabulary, grammar and reading comprehension, and integrate multi - dimensional learning objectives such as cross - cultural communication, critical thinking and creative expression. Zhang Youli (2020)^[13] implemented hierarchical teaching in English reading based on the theory of multiple intelligences: first, stratify students and build a diversified reading classroom; second, design diversified teaching contents and objectives for intelligent differences; third, arrange hierarchical reading tasks and implement diversified evaluations. This model aims to give play to students' intelligent advantages, promote the development of weak intelligences and improve the effect of reading teaching. Teachers can let students learn and use English in practice through project - based learning, role - playing, cooperative learning and other ways. In the context of the "double reduction", teachers can use the theory of multiple intelligences to design unit assignments. For example, activate musical intelligence through English songs, exercise bodily - kinesthetic and interpersonal intelligence in role - playing, and promote the development of visual - spatial intelligence through painting design and film and television viewing. The assignment design based on multiple intelligences has various forms and rich contents, which greatly stimulates students' learning interest and initiative. (Ma Xian, 2023)^[11].

3.3. Evaluation and Feedback

The four stages of multiple intelligences foreign language teaching are briefly described as follows: the perception period, activating intelligence through multiple senses and intuitively experiencing the colorfulness of the world; the communication period, deepening emotions through interpersonal interaction and strengthening learning perception through situational experience; the teaching period, integrating intellectual education with strategy teaching to help students discover themselves and tap their potential; the comprehensive application period, evaluating to promote the integration of multiple intelligences, learning with confidence and achieving a new height of self - growth (Huang Yuanzhen, 2003)^[8]. Therefore, under the guidance of the theory of multiple intelligences, evaluation and feedback play a vital role in English teaching. They are not only tools to measure students' learning effectiveness but also important means to promote students' intelligent development and self - cognition.

The teaching evaluation process is very important when evaluating the application effect of the theory of multiple intelligences in high school English teaching. If the traditional model is continued to be used, it will not only aggravate the subjectivity of evaluation but also may mislead students' cognition of the teaching model under this theory, cause understanding deviations and affect the accurate evaluation of the overall teaching effect (He Gang, 2023)^[7]. Traditional evaluation often only pays attention to linguistic intelligence and academic performance, but the theory of multiple intelligences requires us to consider students' multiple intelligences such as logical - mathematical intelligence, spatial intelligence and interpersonal intelligence in evaluation. Therefore, the evaluation should cover students' performance in listening, speaking, reading, writing, as well as team cooperation, innovative thinking and other aspects to more comprehensively understand students' learning situation. In addition to traditional written examinations, we should also integrate a variety of evaluation methods such as observation method, work analysis method and self - reflection method to comprehensively capture the diversified appearance of students' intelligent development.

4. Challenges and Countermeasures Faced by the Theory of Multiple Intelligences in English Teaching

4.1. Challenges Faced by the Theory of Multiple Intelligences in English Teaching

Although the application of the theory of multiple intelligences in English teaching provides a new perspective and method for education, it also faces many challenges in practice. First of all, the obvious misunderstandings in the current practice of quality - oriented education are as follows: the traditional exam - oriented teaching model still dominates the classroom, while the cultivation of students' qualities is marginalized to the category of "activity courses". This is actually a profound misunderstanding of the essence of "quality - oriented education", and it is no different from building a castle in the air to attempt to improve students' comprehensive abilities only by such means, which is difficult to stabilize the foundation. (Li Ming & Wei Lei, 2016)^[9]. Secondly, the theory of multiple intelligences emphasizes that education should pay attention to students' individual differences and intelligence diversity, which requires teachers to have a high degree of professional literacy and flexibility to identify and cultivate different intelligence fields of students. However, when teachers are limited by time and resources, how to effectively implement multiple intelligences teaching strategies is a practical problem. Middle school English teachers face huge teaching pressure, which often leads to the imbalance of controlling teaching time and progress, failure to flexibly adjust teaching strategies according to the theory of multiple intelligences, and neglect of in - depth exploration and teaching students in accordance with their aptitudes for different intelligence fields of students. This current situation makes students fall into a passive learning state and their enthusiasm is frustrated. (Ma Hong, 2022)^[11]. Secondly, the implementation of the theory of multiple intelligences requires schools and educational institutions to provide corresponding support and resources, including professional development opportunities, teaching materials and assessment tools, etc. In an

environment with limited resources, how to ensure the sufficiency and suitability of these supports and resources is a problem that must be solved when implementing the theory of multiple intelligences. In addition, the evaluation system of the theory of multiple intelligences is different from the traditional standardized test, and it requires more comprehensive and personalized evaluation methods. How to design and implement evaluation tools that can accurately reflect the development of students' multiple intelligences is a challenge faced by educators. Finally, the implementation of the theory of multiple intelligences also requires the participation and support of parents and the community.

4.2. Countermeasures Faced by the Theory of Multiple Intelligences in English Teaching

The application of diversified teaching methods is a key link in the application work of the theory of multiple intelligences in high school English teaching, and it is also a basic guarantee measure to improve students' English core literacy (He Gang, 2020)^[7]. In the face of the challenges faced by the theory of multiple intelligences in English teaching, educators need to take a series of countermeasures to ensure the effective implementation of the theory. First of all, the theory of multiple intelligences puts forward higher requirements for English teachers: they need to continuously update their knowledge structure, actively embrace and internalize new educational concepts, and keep up with the front-line dynamics of teaching. Secondly, teachers should establish the concept of all-around education, master various skills, create a learning environment that promotes the development of students' multiple intelligences, and accurately meet the personalized needs of each student. In this process, the teachers' personal example is the most critical, and their demonstration effect is irreplaceable (Huang Yuanzhen, 2003)^[8]. Again, schools should reasonably plan and allocate teaching resources, encourage resource sharing among teachers, and at the same time use internal and external school resources such as libraries, community centers and online platforms to provide students with rich learning materials and activities. The innovation of the evaluation system is also important. Developing diversified evaluation tools and methods such as project assignments, oral reports and peer evaluation can more comprehensively evaluate students' language abilities and the development of other intelligent fields. Finally, the participation of parents and the community is an important link to achieve the teaching goals of multiple intelligences. Through parent-teacher meetings, workshops and community activities, enhance parents' and the community's understanding and support for the theory of multiple intelligences, encourage parents to participate in their children's learning process, and form an educational joint force with the school.

5. Conclusion

In fact, the theory of multiple intelligences provides teachers with a teaching means, which is neither a teaching method or teaching technology, nor a teaching approach or style. The theory of multiple intelligences provides a new idea for reducing students' academic pressure and cultivating students' core literacy abilities. In the process of sorting out the literature, many scholars have carried out research on English teaching around the theory of multiple intelligences.

They all believe that the theory of multiple intelligences has a far-reaching effect on the personalized growth and development of students. If teachers observe and formulate targeted measures in the daily teaching process, students' core literacy abilities will be correspondingly improved. However, according to the reality of education, most teachers find it difficult to continuously implement this concept in the classroom because of the pressure of schoolwork assessment, resulting in the slow development of students' intelligence. This puts forward a new direction for the future research on how to design a classroom that balances teaching pressure and intelligence development.

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
