GRADUATE SUMMER PROGRAM AT IDAHO

Under a recently launched graduate plan at the University of Idaho teachers in vocational agriculture may meet their graduate residence requirement through four week summer sessions. It will take four of these sessions to

meet the resident credit needed for a master's degree. This plan will enable more teachers to attend summer school by using their vacation time and an additional two weeks provided by the local district. Two courses were offered this summer. One of the courses was presented by the Department of Agricultural Chemistry, dealing with soil testing and the chemistry of irrigation water. The other was a graduate course in Agricultural Education entitled "Adult Programs in Agriculture." Four semester credits may be earned during the four weeks.
