Honoring my dad: A Legacy that lives on

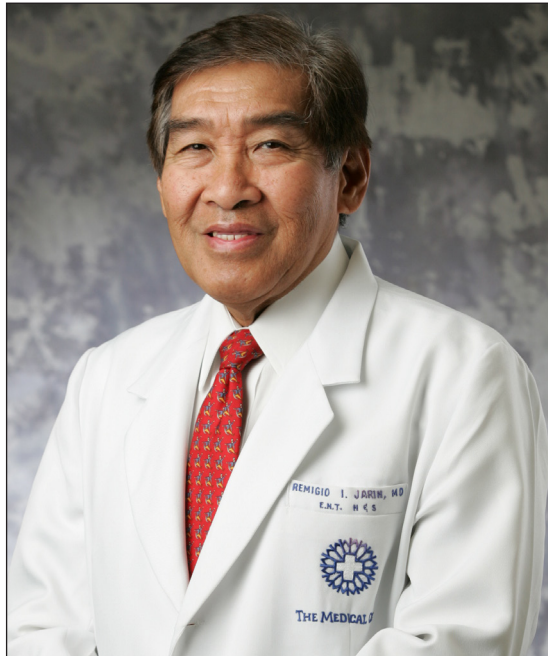
