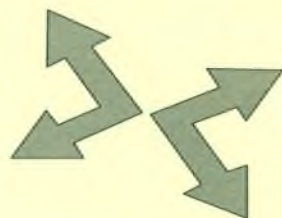
Networks

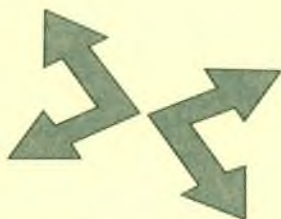

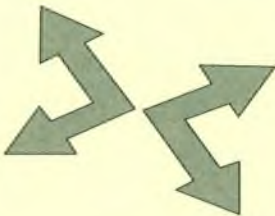
