The author believes that there is a need for greater selectivity in the building of research library collections, based on an understanding of subject literatures as phenomena—their creation, behavior, and use. He draws concepts from the "new" discipline of information science—including statistical discoveries of Bradford, Zipf, and Booth, as well as epidemic theory, citation tracing, and the research front—and applies them as tools in analyzing the literature of information science itself. His further purpose is to begin a synthesis of these techniques.
