
1- Side wide shot of a kid on a swing




 Detail shot where we see of the tension of the ropes that sustain the house, trembling.




3- Panoramic Wide Shot of the house attached to the cliff, frovery far away. We can still see the swing swinging from the



4. Front wide shot of the house. We see the father opening and closing the door on his way out. He rings the bell, right by the door, calling for his son to come upstairs.




5- Frontal shot of the kid swinging, with forced perspective. The kid looks up while he hears the bell ringing.







12- POV shot of the father breaking bigger ice pieces into smaller ones and forming a small pile of ice cubes. His son his putting thos smaller ice cubes inside the father's Ice bag.
