

The Catholic Association for International Peace (CAIP) is the only organization working exclusively to implement sound principles of international relations in accord with the teachings of the Church.

Founded in 1926-27, CAIP functions with the encouragement of the American Hierarchy. Membership is open to all Catholics of the United States interested in the promotion of international justice, charity and peace.

The Association's purpose is to further, in accord with the teachings of the Church, the "Peace of Christ in the Kingdom of Christ," through the preparation and dissemination of studies applying Christian teaching to international life.

CAIP publishes a monthly newsletter, CAIP NEWS, which is sent free to members as a part of their membership (non-member subscription is \$1.25 per year). It also issues policy statements on current international questions, and occasional pamphlets.

The CAIP Annual Conference features a Mass for Peace, addresses by outstanding leaders in international affairs, general discussion, committee meetings, and the presentation of the Annual Peace Award.

The Association has observer status with the United Nations and maintains regular liaison with the U.S. Department of State.

The Association's affairs are supervised and controlled by the Executive Council, consisting of a president, nine vice-presidents, a treasurer, assistant treasurer, an executive secretary, and the chairmen of the report committees.

All studies, reports, statements and resolutions on questions of international policy originate in committees, are passed on by them and are issued only with the approval of the Executive Council.
