## Resolution on **HUMAN LIFE FOUNDATION**

## NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS

November 20, 1975

Just over six years ago the Human Life Foundation was established to encourage scientific research in natural family planning, and to promote educational efforts that would enable married couples to use responsibly those natural methods of family planning "whose safeness has been proven and whose harmony with the moral order has been ascertained. (Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, #87) The Foundation was the first of its kind in the entire world, and has played a major role in generating international interest and worldwide scientific research.

The National Conference of Catholic Bishops takes this occasion to recognize with approval and appreciation the dedicated work of the Board of Directors, the Advisory Committees, and the Staff of the Human Life Foundation. The work of the Human Life Foundation, in which we are proud to have a part, will considerably advance the welfare of marriage and the family, by leading those who are skilled in the sciences-notably the medical, biological, social and psychological-to pool their efforts in perfecting the natural methods of family planning so as to explain more thoroughly the various conditions favoring a proper regulation of births.
