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PURPOSE OF PRAYER

MODEL FOR PRAYER

Our Lord prayed perfectly, ceaselessly. His soul was always united with His Heavenly Father. He tells us: "Pray always." Like the Apostles, let us often go to Him, BEG-GING: "Lord, teach us to pray!"

PRAYER BEFORE PRAYER

Open, O Lord, our mouths to bless Thy Holy Name. Cleanse our hearts from all vain, bad, and distracting thoughts; enlighten our understanding, inflame our will, that we may worthily, attentively, and devoutly recite these prayers and deserve to be heard in the presence of Thy divine majesty: through Christ Our Lord. PRAYER FOR SELF

MORNING OFFERING

(Say it every morning; never leave it out. This is your most important prayer.)

O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer Thee all my prayers, works, and sufferings—all my thoughts, words, and actions—of this day, for all the intentions of Thy Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, in reparation for my sins, for the intentions of all our Associates, and in particular for the intention of our Holy Father for this month (specify intention).

(The Holy Father's intention for each month is listed in CATHOLIC QUOTE, St. Benedict's Abbey, Atchison, Kansas, and in many other Catholic magazines and newspapers.)

A MORNING PRAYER

O Lord God Almighty, Who hast safely brought us to the beginning of this day, let Thy powerful grace so conduct us through it that we may not fall into any sin, but that all our words, thoughts, and works may be guided by the rules of Thy heavenly justice and tend to the observance of Thy Holy Law. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

SHORT MORNING PRAYER TO CHRIST

Great and Glorious God, my Lord Jesus Christ!

I implore Thee to enlighten me and to disperse the darkness of my soul.

Give me true faith, firm hope, and

perfect charity.

Grant me, O Lord, to know Thee so well that in all things I may act by Thy light and in accordance with Thy Holy Will. Amen.

PRAYER FOR TODAY

O My God, this day in my prayers, I would remember:

My mother and father,

My brothers, sisters, relatives,

Friends and benefactors.

Those who love me and those who hate me.

The dying and those to die today.

The poor souls in purgatory.

The Holy Father and his intentions. Mother Church and all her children.

All bishops, priests, brothers, and sisters.

My country, its president and all its officials,

The greatest and least of its citizens, Those who died in military service for it,

Those who lost loved ones in the struggle.

The world and all its peoples.

All nations and all races,

The sick, the poor, the rich,

The neglected, the persecuted, the enslaved,

The tempted, the doubting, the despairing,

Those in danger and distress.

Men of good will that they may

come to the fullness of the Faith. Men of evil ways that they may be converted.

The triumph of God's Infinite Mercy in my life and in all lives: Through the merits of the Most Precious Blood of Jesus, and the intercession of His Most Holy Mother. Amen.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

(Give your SOUL meals daily; keep it strong and growing as you do your body.)

O Jesus, I believe that Thou art truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. I love Thee above all things, and I desire to possess Thee within my soul. Since I cannot now receive Thee Sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace Thee as already being there, and unite myself wholly to Thee. Never permit me to be separated from Thee. Amen.

CONSECRATION TO MARY

(The Mother of Jesus will help you to love her Divine Son. Ask her for her assistance.) O Mary, My Queen, My Mother, I give myself entirely to Thee, and to show my devotion to Thee, I consecrate to Thee this day my eyes, my ears, my mouth, my heart, my whole being without reserve.

Therefore, Good Mother, as I am Thine own, keep me, guard me as Thy property and possession.

FATIMA PRAYER

(A prayer sent from Heaven to our "modern" unbelieving world. It is simple to learn. Say it often: YOUR REPARATION is needed.)

O My God, I believe, I adore, I hope, I love Thee:

And I ask forgiveness for all those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope, and do not love.

SHORT CONSECRATION

I am all Thine, O Jesus, and all that I have belongs to Thee, through Mary, Thy Most Holy Mother.

ANGELUS

V. The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary,

R. And she conceived of the Holy

Ghost. Hail Mary, etc.

V. Behold, the Handmaid of the Lord!

R. Be it done unto me according to Thy Word. Hail Mary, etc.

V. The Word was made Flesh (gen-uflect),

R. And dwelt among us. Hail Mary, etc.

V. Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God,

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

LET US PRAY: Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy grace into our hearts, that we to whom the Incarnation of Christ, Thy Son, was made known by the message of an Angel, may by His Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of His Resurrection, through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen.

REGINA COELI (Instead of Angelus during Eastertide)

V. O Queen of Heaven, rejoice! Alleluia.

R. For He whom thou didst merit to bear, Alleluia,

V. Has arisen, as He said, Alleluia.

R. Pray for us to God, Alleluia.

V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, Alleluia.

R. For the Lord hath risen indeed, Alleluia.

LET US PRAY: O God, Who, through the Resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, didst vouchsafe to fill the world with joy; grant, we beseech Thee, that, through His Virgin Mother, Mary, we may lay hold on the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

MEMORARE

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired with this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother; to thee I come; before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy, hear and answer me. Amen.

CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH

O Blessed Saint Joseph! I consecrate myself to they honor, and give myself to thee, that thou mayest always be my father, my protector, and my guide in the way of salvation. Obtain for me a great purity of heart and a fervent love of the interior life. After thy example may I do all my actions for the greater glory of God, in union with the Divine Heart of Jesus and the immaculate heart of Mary! And do thou, O blessed Joseph, pray for me, that I may experience the peace and joy of thy holy death. Amen.

GUARDIAN ANGEL PRAYER

(Be sure to say this prayer which you learned as a little child at least every morning and night. Too many people shamefully forget their Heavenly Companion.)

Angel of God, my Guardian dear, To whom His love commits me here:

Ever this day (night) be at my side To light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.

PATRON SAINT

(Do you ever think of your patron saint? Remember: He (she) is your protector and model. Walk with your Heavenly Representative!)

Holy Patron, St., pray for me, and teach me e'er to follow thee.

ANOTHER PATRON SAINT PRAYER

O Great Saint, whose name I bear, protect me, pray for me, that, like thee, I may serve God faithfully on earth, and glorify Him eternally with thee in heaven. Amen.

PRAYER TO ALL THE SAINTS

O Holy Mary and all the Saints, intercede for us to God, that we may deserve to be heard and saved by Him, Who livest and reignest forever and ever. Amen.

PRAYER FOR THE DYING

(Prepare for your own death by praying daily for the dying.)

Most Merciful Jesus, lover of souls, I pray Thee by the agony of Thy Most Sacred Heart, and by the sorrows of Thy Immaculate Mother, to wash in Thy Most Precious Blood, the sinners of the world who are now in their agony and who are to die this day (night).

Heart of Jesus, once in agony,

have mercy on the dying.

O St. Joseph, Foster Father of Jesus, true Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Patron of a happy death, pray for us and for the dying of today (tonight). Amen.

PRAYER TO OUR LADY FOR A HAPPY DEATH

O Mary! I beseech thee by the sorrows thou didst experience in beholding thy Divine Son dying on the cross, procure for me a good death; obtain for me that, having loved Jesus and thee, my most tender Mother, here on earth, I may love you both and bless you eternally in heaven. Amen.

POOR SOULS

(Do you pray for them regularly? Let us hearken to their cry, "Have pity on me, at least you, my FRIENDS!" and help them.) Pray often:

Eternal rest grant unto all the faithful departed, O Lord,

And let perpetual light shine upon them!

May they rest in peace! Amen.

PRAYER FOR A GOOD HEART

Give me, O Lord, an ever watchful heart, which no subtle speculation may lure from Thee.

Give me a noble heart, which no unworthy affection can draw downward to the earth.

Give me an upright heart, which no insincere intention can warp.

Give me a firm heart, which no

tribulation can crush or quell.

Give me a free heart, which no perverted or impetuous affection can claim for its own. Amen.

EVENING PRAYERS

(Recommended for family prayer.)

O my God, I present myself before Thee at the end of another day, to offer Thee anew the homage of my heart. I humbly adore Thee, my Creator, my Redeemer, and my Judge! I believe in Thee, because Thou art faithful to Thy promises; I love Thee with my whole heart, because Thou art infinitely worthy of being loved; and for Thy sake I

love my neighbor as myself.

Enable me, O my God, to return Thee thanks as I ought for all Thine inestimable blessings and favors. Thou hast thought of me, and loved me from all eternity; Thou hast formed me out of nothing; Thou has delivered up Thy Beloved Son to the ignominious death of the Cross for my redemption; Thou hast made me a member of Thy holy Church; Thou hast preserved me from falling into the abyss of eternal misery, when my sins had provoked Thee to punish me; and Thou hast graciously continued to spare me, even though I have not ceased to offend Thee. What return, O my God, can I make for Thine innumerable blessings, and particularly for the favors of this day? O all ye Angels and Saints, unite with me in praising the God of mercies, who is so bountiful to so unworthy a creature.

Prayer Before Examination of Conscience

O my God, sovereign Judge of men, who desirest not the death of a sinner, but that he should be converted and saved, enlighten my mind, that I may know the sins I have this day committed in thought, word, or deed, and give me the grace of true contrition.

Act of Contrition

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of hell, but most of all because I have offended Thee, my God, who art allgood and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

O God, hear my prayers on behalf of our Holy Father, Pope N.,

our Bishop N., our clergy, and for all that are in authority over us. Bless, I beseech Thee, the whole Catholic Church, and convert all heretics and unbelievers. Pour down Thy blessings, O Lord, upon all my friends, relations, and acquaintances, and upon my enemies, if I have any. Help the poor and sick, and those who are in their last agony. O God of mercy and goodness, have compassion on the souls of the faithful in purgatory; put an end to their sufferings, and grant them eternal light, rest, and happiness. Amen.

O Almighty and Eternal God, who savest all, and willest not that any should perish, look, we beseech Thee, upon the souls that are led astray by the deceits of the devil; that, rejecting all errors, the hearts of those who err may be converted, and return to the unity of Thy truth. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Bless, O Lord, the repose I am about to take, that, my bodily strength being renewed, I may be the better enabled to serve Thee. Amen.

O Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother

of Mercy, pray for me, that I may be preserved this night from all evil, whether of body or soul. Blessed St. Joseph, and all ye Angels and Saints, especially my guardian angel and my chosen patron, watch over me. I commend myself to your protection now and always. Amen.

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts: the earth is full of Thy glory. Glory be to the Father, glory be to the Son, glory be to the Holy

Ghost. Amen.

thinks ever of the beloved.


St. John of the Cross: Let God be the Bridegroom and the Beloved of your soul; remain always in His presence and so you shall avoid sin; learn to love Him and all things will prosper with you. Micheas: I will show thee, O man, what is good, and what the Lord requireth of thee ... to walk carefully with thy God. (Old Testament.)
God: Walk before me and be perfect.

PRAYER FOR FORGIVENESS OF CARELESSNESS

O my God and my All, in Thy goodness and mercy, grant that before I die I may regain all the Graces which I have lost through my carelessness and folly. Permit me to attain that degree of merit and perfection to which Thou didst desire to lead me, and which I failed by my unfaithfulness to reach. Mercifully grant also that others regain the Graces which they have lost through my fault.

PRAYER TO THE GENTLE CHRIST

Eyes of Jesus, look on me. Lips of Jesus, smile on me. Ears of Jesus, hear me. Arms of Jesus, enfold me. Hands of Jesus, bless me. Feet of Jesus, guide me. Voice of Jesus, speak to me. Heart of Jesus, love me. Spirit of Jesus, abide in me. Now and forever. Amen.



(READ AND FOLLOW CARE-FULLY. ENRICH YOUR RO-SARY.)

In imitation of the manner of reciting the Rosary in many foreign countries during past centuries, the Rosary may be said by inserting the mystery into each Hail Mary, after the word "Jesus". Let us take an example: the first glorious mystery. The Hail Mary is said, and after the Name of "Jesus" the mystery is added, thus: " ... fruit of thy womb, Jesus — WHO AROSE FROM THE DEAD. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray, etc." The mystery is said in each Hail Mary, or ten times during each decade.

The three introductory Hail Marys, in which we petition for the three gifts of Faith, Hope, and Charity, are said in the same way. Example: "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee, blessed art thou among women, and blessed is

the fruit of thy womb, Jesus, IN WHOM WE BELIEVE. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen."

Though this way of praying the Rosary requires a little more time, it has two distinct advantages. One is that distractions are reduced and attention is better focused because of the repeated recitation of the particular mystery (ten times instead of only once during each decade). The second is that the Rosary takes on more of a direct conversation with our Lady — which it is supposed to be. You actually talk to the Mother of Jesus about the main mysteries by which her Son redeemed you.

Furthermore, vocal and mental prayer are nicely fused, as are the two elements of the Rosary, the Hail Mary and the mystery. Here is the

Rosary at its best!

The traditional formulation of the mysteries in English is as follows. (Each of the following phrases is inserted after each "Jesus" in every Hail Mary of the respective decade.)

The three introductory Hail Marys:

1) In Whom we believe.

2) In Whom we hope.

3) Whom we love above all things.

The Joyful Mysteries:

1) Whom thou didst conceive of the Holy Ghost.

2) Whom thou didst carry to Eliza-

beth.

- 3) Who was born of thee in Bethlehem.
- 4) Whom thou didst present in the temple.
- 5) Whom thou didst find in the temple.

The Sorrowful Mysteries:

- 1) Who sweat blood for us.
- 2) Who was scourged for us.
- 3) Who was crowned with thorns for us.
- 4) Who carried the heavy cross for us.
- 5) Who was crucified for us.

The Glorious Mysteries:

- 1) Who arose from the dead.
- 2) Who ascended into heaven.
- 3) Who sent us the Holy Ghost.
- 4) Who took thee up into heaven.
- 5) Who crowned thee in heaven.

INSTRUCTIONS

ARE YOU SPIRITUALLY TONGUE-TIED?

You should know a variety of prayers. At least many of those printed in this booklet, besides, of course, the common prayers such as the Our Father, Hail Mary, Apostles' Creed, Hail Holy Queen, Acts of Faith, Hope, Love, Sorrow, etc.

Pray with zest. Try to enlarge and expand your prayer life. Prayer should be something romantic: a love affair between you and your God!

Make your prayer fit the occasion. Your morning prayers, for instance, should consist of the Morning Offering, Spiritual Communion, Consecration to Mary, Angelus, Acts of Faith, Hope, and Love, prayer to your Guardian Angel, prayer to your Patron Saint, Prayer for Today (Page 7), etc. Don't you see how well they fit for opening the day correctly? The Morning Offering to change the

dusty work of your daily routine (no matter how small or insignificant that work may be) into spiritual gold; the Spiritual Communion to feed your soul (since you cannot actually go to Holy Communion) iust as bacon and eggs will feed your weakening human body; the Consecration to Mary to give yourself to your Spiritual Mother; she will be near to protect you from temptation and sin (or don't you need help!) and to keep you near Christ. The Angelus is so beautiful a prayer that it is known even to Protestants. Do you as a Catholic say it when it is supposed to be said -morning, noon, and night?

You say you can't learn all these prayers. All right, learn one, let us say, every month. Read it slowly from this booklet every day. It will stay with you gradually. Then go to the next one next month. You can learn the main ones if you really

want to.

You will admit that you should know more prayers. Do something about it then. It's a downright shame to be so spiritually tonguetied as so many of us are!

THE COUNTERFEITER, or WORKING ONESELF TO DEATH

Working (or doing anything else) without the blessing of God, as for example, in the state of mortal sin or even without a good intention, is doing like that forger of bills who for ten years of his life was bent on amassing a fortune by making counterfeit money. 'This is a sure and short road to wealth,' thought he; 'for as soon as my money begins to pass around, my income will be immense!' So day by day he slaved and long into the night, perfecting his dies and forging money until beads of perspiration would roll down his face; and his arms, from constant and feverish haste. would fall limp at his side.

At last he was through! Heaps of crisp bills lay stacked around about him ready for circulation. But just as the moneymaker was ready to pass them on, the stamp of the country was changed; the outstanding currency was called in and prohibited thenceforth to serve as a medium for exchange. So it happened that over night all his hopes were crushed and all his labor was in vain.

The greatest dupes the devil has are those men who, as the saying goes, work themselves to death. Men who exhaust an anxious existence in studies and plans and hard work to enrich themselves and their children; who sacrifice even duty, social and religious, only to find out at sad last that they have missed the very end for which they were placed in this world.

It were an infinite tragedy if at the end of life all our toil and labor—or the greater part of it—were stamped as counterfeit. "Lord, we have labored all the night (all our life) and have taken nothing." God help us!

Our good works in themselves are only of passing value, and merit only a temporal reward. It is our union with Christ as members of that mystical body of which He is Head which gives them a supernatural, heavenly, infinite, everlasting value. By keeping ourselves in the state of grace, by frequently receiving the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion, by regular and constant prayer, and by renewing our good intention (Morning Offering) often during the day we are laying by treasure for eternity.

POWER OF PRAYER

Prayer is endowed with the omnipotence of God Himself; and, by prayer, we too become endowed with the same divine attribute, in so far as it places omnipotence at our disposal.

Here, then, we have an instrument in our hands which will work won-

ders for us wherever we will;

a power which nothing can resist; a master-key to all the treasures of heaven:

a shield against every danger;

a comfort in every sorrow;

a light in darkness;

a joy that never fails;

a food that never palls on the taste:

a strength which no hardship can break;

a life which cannot die.

It is a source of knowledge, such as no earthly science can unfold; a mine of wealth yielding treasures of which death cannot rob us; a royal charter of such privileges and dignities as no mortal monarch ever possessed or can bestow.

-Paradise of God.

U-BOMB

However men degrade themselves; however black with sin the world becomes; however desperate the outlook, there is always hope for peace on earth for men of good will.

The specific solution is the U-Bomb of Faith and Hope, not the H-Bomb of death and despair.

And you are the U-Bomb. When you pray, you charge yourself with the grace of God. When you act you trigger off the bomb which sets up chain reactions, not of misery and death, but of peace and life. Every man is needed—but no one can do it all.

There are problems so big and so complex that not one but a whole cluster of U-Bombs must be fired together to be effective.

In less picturesque but more practical language, this means that on the parish, diocesan, and national levels, there must be a clustering together of our American Catholic men (and women) for unified action if we are going to make the strength of our Faith felt in bringing about the restoration of all things in Christ. —From CATHOLIC MEN,
